ANDREW SQUIRE

In recent years Andrew has travelled and exhibited widely, with artist's residencies in Iceland, Canada and Nepal. These experiences have fed into his development of a wide-ranging visual language, reflecting the complexity of human perceptions.

The deceptively simple paintings in this new collection have eclectic roots, drawing variously on the elemental space and light of Western Scotland, the inner landscape of the subconscious, and iconic images of birds and beasts.

Beautifully composed and making confident use of the visual silence of empty space, there is a recurring contemplative quality and stillness in the work which reaches past the here and now to something beyond.

MYLES OXENFORD

Myles Oxenford offers us a combination of something abstract yet representational. He intensifies the natural landscape or still life with vibrant, colourful brush strokes, experimenting with light, so that his work exudes an expression reminiscent of the Scottish colourists. Myles aims to create paintings that convey the feeling of sitting in and becoming part of the landscape. Recent still life work has given a new introspection and direction and although he is influenced by traditional elements of painting his works are fresh, individual and influential.

Born in Plymouth and educated at the Edinburgh Leith School of Art, Oxenford brought his flair for the arts from England's Southern tip to the heart of Scotland. He continued his studies at the Falmouth College of Art and on graduation, in 2002, became a full-time painter. An invitation to paint for solo exhibition at the Royal Cornwall Museum, and to enter work at the Discerning Eye in 2004 brought him to the attention of commercial galleries. Now, with three successful solo shows to his credit his paintings are in demand for mixed exhibitions in London, Suffolk and Cornwall.
